Types of Events

Outdoor Education is available March through mid-June for Spring or September through October for the fall. We can accommodate groups from 25 to 400 people.

Location & Facilities

Camp Sealth is located on 400 acres of forest and wetlands, with over a mile of saltwater beach on Vashon Island, Washington. Vashon Island is accessible only by ferry from Seattle, Tacoma or Southworth.

Cabins are dorm-style, with 4 to 10 beds per room and separate bathhouses. Buildings are basic but comfortable; about half of the cabins are winterized for year-round use.

The main dining hall (Rounds Hall) is a large space suitable for big groups and is easily accessible from all cabins.

Services Provided

Lodging is available for up to 400 in warmer months (May through September), and for up to 250 the rest of the year. We provide food service for all main camp groups. Groups using the Wrangler Retreat Center for lodging may do their own food service.

Our Outdoor Education staff are trained in a wide variety of activities including Forest, Marine, and Wetland Ecologies, Survival and Outdoor Skills, Sustainability, and Renewable Energy. Students can also enjoy camp activities such as canoeing, archery, and arts and crafts.
