

GENERAL INFORMATION

Camp Sealth is owned and operated by Camp Fire Central Puget Sound. Our rustic 400-acre, camp is located on Vashon Island in the heart of the Puget Sound and has been for 100 years!

Camp Fire has been an innovative leader in youth development for 109 years. You might remember us as Camp Fire Girls or Camp Fire USA, which were key parts of our organizational journey. Today, our commitment to diversity and inclusion are important parts of what makes us different.

FACILITY RATES, RESERVATIONS, AND DEPOSIT

Camp Sealth offers several cabins for weekend rental in August, September, and October of 2020 only for overnight lodging. Cabins sleep 10 people.

Cabin rates will vary based on included amenities and dates selected, but start at \$200 for the weekend. Check-in time is 4pm-7pm and check out is 12pm.

To view offerings, go to <https://campfireseattle.org/rent-a-cabin/>. Through this website reservations can also be made. Reservations must be made by the Wednesday prior to stay; walk up reservations will not be accepted. Payment is due IN FULL at the time of reservation. Up to a \$100 fee may be added to your final bill if any damages are incurred or if proper check out procedures are not met. You will be notified prior to any charges applied.

If Camp Fire must cancel a reservation, a full refund will be issued if we cannot move your reservation to an alternative date. If you need to cancel your reservation, you may be able to do so by calling the office at 206-463-3174 ext. 34. Cancellations made after 4:00pm the Wednesday prior will not be refunded.

Additionally Camp Fire reserves the right to cancel a reservation without refund if all required forms and documents are not returned prior to 11:00am on the day of arrival

MEAL SERVICE

Campers are required to bring their own food and prepare their own meals at camp. Cabins are not equipped with a kitchen or refrigeration. It is the responsibility of the group /family to practice proper food storage and cooking. Two shared fire pits are available in Wrangler Meadow and are first come, first serve amongst cabin rentals. Other pits on our grounds may be available if all are full, talk to your host for suggestions.

Fire availability will be contingent upon State and Local Burn Restrictions; propane stoves are encouraged in these cases. All food must be stored properly at all times outside of cabins in durable coolers and bins. The camp kitchen will not be available for the preparation or storage of food. Coolers and propane stoves are available upon request, as well as Ice is available for purchase, these add on can be made during the registration process.

MEDICAL AND EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

Family groups must have a designated vehicle and driver on site for emergency purposes. There will not be a medical professional on site during your stay. Camp Staff can be reached by calling the Administrator on Duty cell phone at 206-612-5179 in case of an emergency.

NATURAL DISASTER / EVACUATION PLAN

If you hear a loud siren that stays on one pitch (does not undulate), please put on your shoes and socks and head to the open field in the middle of the cabin area. Wait here for further instructions from camp staff members.

ENVIRONMENT & TERRAIN

Our camp is a very special place to us!

Please leave all flowers and plants in the ground for others to enjoy. The terrain of camp is natural, so it can be quite rocky and uneven. There are steep and dusty hills that can become difficult to navigate so we strongly suggest sturdy, closed-toe shoes or hiking sandals with backstraps. No flip-flops please.

PROGRAM AREAS

All of Camp Sealths program area will be closed during your stay with us. This includes: horse pasture and arenas, the challenge course, bouldering wall, archery ranges, various buildings around camp, and the waterfront. You are welcome to enjoy the various hiking trails around camp, the beach (just please do not enter the water, and please refrain from climbing on the bulk head), and other outdoor natural areas.

CHECK IN

Once you arrive in camp, you are welcome to enter your assigned cabin, we will be conducting contactless check in, so please once you have settled contact the camp Administrator on Duty at 206-612-5179 and let them know you have arrived. Please let us know if you find any issues such as light bulbs burnt out upon checkin.

CHECK OUT

Families are required to leave their cabin and surrounding area clean. Families are responsible for the following before leaving:

- Sweep floor of cabin and stairs
- Ensure beds are placed in original position
- Make sure all trash has been placed in the unit trash can
- Make sure all indoor and outdoor lights are off (where applicable)
- Return any rented or checked-out items (sports equipment, sleeping bags, games, etc.)
- Report any damage or required maintenance (light bulbs out, smoke detector batteries, etc.) to camp staff

GENERAL POLICIES

Safety Orientation and Rules

- Families must follow the policies and rules listed in this Manual.
- Questions may be directed to the Camp Sealth Staff.
- Any and all security or safety concerns regarding the site should be reported directly to the Camp Staff by calling or texting the Administrator on Duty phone.
- No pets are allowed during your stay at camp

Social Distancing & Boundaries

- Families should observe social distancing practices with other families while on the property.
- Participants are also asked to respect camp boundaries accessing only areas as described here.
- Participants are asked to never enter a cabin that is not rented to them and to refrain from entering other camp buildings. Failure to adhere to boundaries or physical distancing practices may result in your removal from camp property. In these cases, no refund will be given.

Supervision

- Parents and/or guardians of minor participants are responsible for the supervision and behavior of their minor children at all times. Children should always be with their parents/guardians.

Leave No Trace

- At Camp Sealth we practice the Leave No Trace Philosophy of Camping and expect that our participants will do the same. Please ensure that you leave your area, and our camp, in the same or better condition than you found it.
- Food in cabins attracts animals so we ask that you keep food in coolers and other sealable bins so as not to invite critters into your cabins.
- Camping areas should be kept litter-free.
- Garbage should be placed in cans with liners and lids available in each unit and throughout camp.

Personal Property

- Camp Sealth does not assume any responsibility for lost, stolen, or damaged personal equipment or items. Such equipment may include, but is not limited to, personal vehicles (and contents), luggage (and contents), electronics, instruments, and/or recreational gear or equipment.

Bathrooms

Camp Sealth is 100 years old and some of our plumbing is very old. We ask, therefore, that you please be gentle with it. Please use the provided garbage receptacles for feminine hygiene products and anything else that may be difficult for the septic system.

Quiet Hours

Sound carries easily through the woods and across the water. Quiet hours are from 10pm until 7am. We ask that you respect your neighbors at camp and our neighbors on the lake and adhere to these quiet hours. Failure to comply with these hours will result in your removal from camp property.

COVID-19 POLICIES

- Prior to arrival, each family will be asked to submit a health screening attesting they have not experienced any of the known Covid-19 symptoms and have not be in contact with anyone who is confirmed or suspected of having Covid-19 in the past 14 days.
- Cabins will be cleaned 24 hours after the departure of each family with CDC approved cleaning products; this includes every flat surface, bed, and high-touch areas in each cabin, even if it was not used.
- Bathrooms will be cleaned 24 hours after the departure of each family with CDC approved cleaning products; this includes every flat surface, sink, faucet, shower, toilet, and high-touch areas.
- Outside common areas such as picnic tables will be cleaned after the departure of each family, each cabin will have an assigned picnic table.
- Masks are required when outside the family's assigned cabin and unable to maintain 6ft social distance from staff or other guests.
- Guests should not enter any buildings other than their assigned cabin/bathroom, including the cabins of other guests.
- During your stay with us you will have one assigned point of contact; this person can be reached by contacting the Camp Sealth 24-hour Administrator on Duty cell phone at: 206-612-5179. Camp staff will wear masks when interacting with guests.
- Should the need arise for staff to enter a cabin for facility or maintenance reasons, we ask that all members of the family exit the cabin, allow the Sealth staff to enter and address the issue, and we will inform you once the issue is resolved and you may reenter the cabin. Camp staff will wear masks while in the cabin and sanitize before leaving.
- We ask that you leave the cabin as you found it. Brooms and dust pans are available in each cabin. Trash from the cabin can be collected and placed in the larger trash cans on the east side of Parsons Lodge.

DRIVING DIRECTIONS TO CAMP SEALTH

Vashon Island is accessible only by ferry or private boat. A car and passenger ferry operated by the Washington Department of Transportation is available from West Seattle (Fauntleroy (West Seattle) / Vashon), the Kitsap Peninsula (Southworth / Vashon) or Tacoma (Pt. Defiance / Tahlequah). Current round trip ferry fare traveling to Vashon is about \$25 for a car and driver and \$5 for a passenger though rates can fluctuate depending on the season. Ferry service back to the mainland is always free. Be sure to plan extra time when traveling by ferry, especially when arriving during peak travel times.

From the Southworth or Fauntleroy Ferry

When the ferry unloads, follow the traffic up the hill to the left – this is Vashon Highway. Follow Vashon Highway south for about 12 miles, through the (small) towns of Vashon and Burton. Three miles past the four-way stop in Burton, take a sharp right turn onto Wax Orchard Road. Follow Wax Orchard for ½ mile, then turn left onto Camp Sealth Road. It takes about 25 minutes to get to camp from the Southworth/Fauntleroy ferry dock.

From the Pt. Defiance / Tahlequah (Tacoma) Ferry

When the ferry unloads, follow the traffic to the left – this is Vashon Highway. Follow Vashon Highway north for about 2 miles. At the fork in the road, veer left onto Wax Orchard Road. Follow Wax Orchard for ½ mile, then turn left onto Camp Sealth Road. It takes about 15 minutes to get to camp from the Pt. Defiance ferry dock.

Arriving at Camp

The camp road is long, narrow and steep. For everyone's safety, please keep a speed limit of 10 mph and stay to the right side of the road. Watch out for horses and hikers along the road.

Main Camp: Misty, Milky, Village Cabin Rentals

Follow the road for 1 ½ miles, until you see the water. Parking is available in the gravel lot alongside the big, grassy field. Summer campers check in at the table right next to the parking lot. Rental group participants should check in at the office, the two-story building beside the water, unless otherwise directed.

Wrangler Retreat Center: Wrangler Cabin Rental

The turn-off for Wrangler is on the right, about ¾ miles after you turn on to the camp road and before heading down the steep hill.
